CABINET APPROVES IMPLEMENTATION OF VISA REQUIREMENT FOR NON-RECIPROCATING COUNTRIES

The Cabinet of the Republic of Namibia has granted authorization to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety and Security to introduce an entry visa requirement to countries that have not reciprocated the favourable treatment granted to their nationals when visiting Namibia. This strategic decision, aimed at fostering fair and balanced diplomatic relations, will affect a total of 31 countries.

In recent years, the Republic of Namibia through the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety and Security has extended gestures of goodwill and favourable treatment to nationals of various countries. However, despite these efforts, certain nations have not reciprocated. In light of this disparity, the government has deemed it necessary to implement a visa requirement to ensure parity and fairness in diplomatic interactions.

The date of implementation and application will be communicated at a later stage through diplomatic channels. Nationals from the following 31 countries will be issued with visas upon arrival in Namibia at an applicable fee in addition to online visa application.
